Disability: Blind & vision Impaired (include not only those who are totally blind, but also those with limited vision)

Possible Access Issues	Possible Solutions
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>P Path of travel</li> <li>P Displays of information</li> <li>P Controls with written directions</li> <li>P Elevators operating buttons</li> <li>P Completion of written forms</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>P "Talking" computers, calculators</li> <li>P Labeling in braille</li> <li>P Respond to questions orally</li> <li>P Air radio announcements</li> <li>P Avoid clutter in passageways</li> <li>P Use writing, drawing, optical aids (e.g. magnifiers)</li> </ul>

Disability: Deaf & Hearing Impaired (including not only those persons who are totally deaf, but also those with limited hearing)

Disability: Psychological Disabilities

Disability: Difficulty with Upper Body Movement (including not only those persons who have limited use of arms, shoulder; persons who use wheelchairs or crutches; people of short stature; those who cannot perform certain hand movements, or have difficulty controlling movement)

Possible Access Issues	Possible Solutions
Difficulty operating (or locating or reaching) certain hardware: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Hand controls on doors</li> <li>2. Toilet room fixtures</li> <li>3. Water fountains</li> <li>4. Telephones</li> <li>5. Vending machines</li> <li>6. Light fixtures</li> </ol>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>6 Relocating a program or service to accessible area               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a Use of adaptive equipment or modification of present hardware</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

## Examples of Disabilities, Possible Access Issues, & Accommodations

Disability: Mobility Impairments (including those persons having difficulties, stamina limitations, as well as those who use wheelchairs and crutches).

Possible Access Issues	Possible Solutions
<p><b>P</b> No grasp bars, handrails, other supports</p> <p><b>P</b> No designated parking spaces for disabled people</p> <p><b>p</b> Distance from parking, public transportation stops</p> <p><b>s</b> Route of travel</p> <p>1. Curbs, walks, unlevelled surfaces</p> <p>2. Carpeting, Textured tile supports</p> <p>2 Entrances and doors</p> <p>2 Restrooms, phones, water fountains</p> <p>2 Location of controls, general hardware</p>	<p>2 Replace existing hardware, equipment</p> <p>2 Make necessary structural changes to eliminate barriers;</p> <p>1. Install ramps</p> <p>2. Widen doorways</p>
